**NOTICE OF DAY OF REVIEW OF DRAINAGE DISTRICT BOUNDARIES
AND DAY OF REVIEW OF APPORTIONMENTS**

(In accordance with P.A. 40, of 1956, as amended)

Notice is Hereby Given that on Friday, August 25, 2017, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., the Ingham County Drain Commissioner will hold a Day of Review of Drainage District Boundaries and a Day of Review of Apportionments at the Office of the Ingham County Drain Commissioner, 707 Buhl, Mason, Michigan 48854; and the Livingston County Drain Commissioner will hold a Day of Review of Drainage District Boundaries only, at the Office of the Livingston County Drain Commissioner, 2300 East Grand River, Suite 105, Howell, Michigan 48843. At that time and at those places, the Drain Commissioners will hear the proofs and allegations and carefully reconsider and review the description of lands within their respective counties comprising the Drainage District for the West Cedar River Intercounty Drain, and determine whether the addition or deletion of lands will more accurately define the boundaries of the land benefitted by the Intercounty Drain and is just and equitable pursuant to Section 197 of 1956 PA 40, as amended. The Ingham County Drain Commissioner will also review the apportionment of benefits to Ingham County parcels and municipalities only for assessment purposes. The Drain is located and established in the following municipalities, and a general description of the lands proposed to be added or deleted, in whole or in part, include the following:

Ingham County:	Leroy Township – Sections 1, 12, 13, 24, 25, 35 and 36 Stockbridge Township – Sections 1 and 2 Village of Webberville – Section 12 White Oak Township – Sections 1, 2, 11, 12, 13, 14, 23, 24, 25, 26, 35 and 36
Livingston County:	Conway Township – Section 31 Handy Township – Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33 and 34 Iosco Township – Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34 and 35 Unadilla Township – Sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6

The Ingham County Drain Commissioner will have the tentative apportionments against Ingham County parcels and municipalities within the Drainage District available to review. Drain assessments will be collected in the same manner as property taxes. If Drain assessments are to be collected in installments, they may be paid in full with any interest to date at any time to avoid further interest charges. A map of the proposed Drainage District boundary revisions may be found at the County Drain Commissioner's Offices or their web sites (dr.ingham.org and livgov.com/drain).

The entities to be assessed at large are as follows: Ingham County, Leroy Township, Stockbridge Township, Village of Webberville, and White Oak Township; and the State of Michigan Department of Transportation. A description of the land constituting the special assessment district, as currently proposed, for the West Cedar River Intercounty Drain is as follows:

Leroy Township, Ingham County - T.3N.-R.2E.

In Section 1 – SE ¼ and the E ½ of the SW ¼ and the S ½ of the NE ¼ and the S 300' OF THE E 500' of the NE ¼ of the NE ¼; In Section 12 – E ½ and the E ½ of the NW ¼ and the E 300 ft. of the SW ¼ of the NW ¼, parts of which are within the Village of Webberville Corporation Limits and the E 300 ft. of the N 600 ft. of the NW ¼ of the SW ¼, parts of which are within the Village of Webberville Corporation Limits; In Section 13 – NE ¼ and the S ½ and the S 200 ft. of the NW ¼; In Section 24 - All of said Section, except the W ½ of the NW ¼ of the NW ¼ and also except the SW ¼ of the SW ¼ of the SW ¼; In Section 26 – The N ½ of the SE ¼ and the SE ¼ of the SE ¼ and the SE ¼ of the NE ¼ and the s ¼ of the SW ¼ of the NE ¼; In Section 36 – All of Section 36.

Stockbridge Township, Ingham County - T.1N.-R.2E.

Conway Township, Livingston County - T.4N.-R.3E.

In Section 31 – S ¼ of the S ½ of the SE ¼.

Handy Township, Livingston County - T.3N.-R.3E.

In Section 5 – The W ½ except the E ¾ of the E ½; All of Section 6; All of Section 7; In Section 8 – The W ¼ and the SW ¼ of the NE ¼ of the NW ¼ and the NW ¼ of the SE ¼ of the NW ¼; In Section 17 – The W ½ and the S ½ of the SE ¼ and the SW ¼ of the SW ¼ of the NW ¼ of the SE ¼; All of Section 18; All of Section 19; All of Section 20; In Section 21 – The W ½ and the W ½ of the NE ¼ and the W ½ of the SE ¼ of the NE ¼ and the S 100 ft. of the W 100 ft. of the NE ¼ of the NE ¼ and the NW ¼ of the SE ¼ and the NW ¼ of the NW ¼ of the SW ¼ of the SE ¼; In Section 28 – The W ¼ and the SE ¼ of the SW ¼; All of Section 29; All of Section 30; All of Section 31; All of Section 32; In Section 33 – The W ¾ and the W ½ of the SE ¼ of the NE ¼ and the W ½ of the NE ¼ of the SE ¼ and the SE ¼ of the SE ¼.

Iosco Township, Livingston County - T.2N.-R.3E.

In Section 3 – The W ½ of the SW ¼; All of Section 4; All of Section 5; All of Section 6; All of Section 7; All of Section 8; All of Section 9; In Section 10 – The W ¼; In Section 15 – The W ½ of the NW ¼ and the W ¼ of the SE ¼ of the NW ¼ and the SW ¼ and the SE ¼ except the NE ¼ of the NE ¼ of the SE ¼; All of Section 16; All of Section 17; All of Section 18; All of Section 19; All of Section 20; All of Section 21; In Section 22 – The W ½ and the W ½ of the NE ¼ and the W ½ of the SE ¼ and the SE ¼ of the SE ¼; All of Section 27; All of Section 28; All of Section 29; All of Section 30; All of Section 31; All of Section 32; All of Section 33; All of Section 34; in Section 35 – The W ¼ ¼ except the N 7/8 of the NW ¼ of the NW ¼ and the W ½ of the E ½ of the SW ¼.

Unadilla Township, Livingston County - T.1N.-R.3E.

In Section 2 – The NW ¼ and the NW ¼ of the SW ¼ and the N ¼ of the NE ¼ of the SW ¼; In Section 3 – The N ½ and the SE ¼ and the N ½ of the NE ¼ of the SW ¼ and the N ¼ of the NW ¼ of the SW ¼; In Section 4 – The N ½ and N ½ of the NE ¼ of the SE ¼ and the NW ¼ of the SW ¼ and the N ¼ of the SW ¼ of the SW ¼ and the W 1/8 of the NE ¼ of the SW ¼; In Section 5 – The N ¾ and the N ½ of the S ½ of the S ½; In Section 6 – The N ½ and the N ½ of the SE ¼ and the N ¼ of the SE ¼ of the SE ¼.

You are Further Notified that persons aggrieved by the decision of the Drain Commissioners to add or delete property to or from a Drainage District may seek judicial review in their respective County Circuit Court within ten (10) days of the decision; and persons aggrieved by the decision of the Ingham County Drain Commissioner with regard to the apportionment of benefits for assessment purposes may appeal to the Ingham County Probate Court within ten (10) days of the Day of Review.
